This interactive, participatory course will equip participants with the practical and analytical tools to apply gender-responsive budgeting (GRB) in their work. Participants will explore concepts of GRB, existing frameworks, and contributions of international development partners including UN Women, IMF, OECD, PEFA Gender Framework. The course will draw on international experiences and will offer in-depth discussions on the key GRB tools and case studies. Trainers use a participatory approach and the latest methods in online training to create an engaging, horizontal learning environment. Participants will learn key foundations and tools of gender-responsive budgeting in an interactive manner, engaging critical thinking and reflexivity, in line with feminist pedagogical principles.

Day 1: 12th February, 2.30-6pm CET

Session 1: Why Gender-responsive Budgeting?

Learn why gender-responsive budgeting matters, and the consequences of not taking women and gender equality into account in budgeting processes.

Session 2: Key concepts - budgeting, gender lenses in budget context

Understand the key concepts you need in order to conduct gender-responsive budgeting, and how to apply a gender lens to budgeting.

Day 2: 14th February, 2.30-6pm CET

Session 3: Budget reforms

Review the main kinds of budget reforms, and how gender equality can be integrated into these processes.

Session 4: Key frameworks and tools for GRB, international experiences and best practices

Analyse key frameworks for gender-responsive budgeting and review good practices from around the world.

Day 3: 16th February, 2.30-6pm CET

Session 5: GRB tools in practice - budget program design, program implementation and monitoring

Explore the key practical tools for applying gender-responsive budgeting and learn how to use these in your work.

Session 6: Next steps for your GRB journey

Identify sources of information and support, how to advocate for gender-responsive budgeting, and how to integrate this into your career.
